Proposed Projects:

1. Trail Maintenance. Thursday, August 27, 2015 – 9 to 11 a.m.

General Description: Add three yards of 1/4"-minus gravel to the north end of Vine Maple Trail.

Project Details: FSP will partner with the city and the Lake Oswego High School Cross Country Team to finish graveling the north end of Vine Maple Trail.

Funding: The city will pay for three yards of ¼"-minus gravel. FSP will pay for drinks and snacks.

Anticipated City Support (staff, materials, etc.): The city will:

- provide three yards of ¼"-minus gravel;
- deliver the gravel to agreed upon sites before the project date;
- provide shovels, rakes, and wheelbarrows as needed; and
- if available, have one staff person at the project site during the project.

2. Restoration Planting and Invasive Removal Project. Saturday, October 17, 2015 – 9 to 11 a.m.

General Description: Plant native trees and plants, and remove English Ivy and other invasive species, from a section of the park.

Project Details: Volunteers will plant native trees and plants, and will remove English Ivy and other invasive species, in an area of the park to be determined within 45 days before the project date.

Funding: FSP and the city will split the cost of up to \$500 for bare root and/or potted native trees and plants. FSP will pay for drinks and snacks.

Anticipated City Support (staff, materials, etc.): The city will:

- acquire \$500 worth of bare root or potted native trees and plants;
- deliver the plants to an agreed upon site before the project date;
- provide shovels, clippers/pruners and other tools as needed; and
- if available, have one staff person at the project site during the project.

3. Restoration Planting. Saturday, February 13, 2016 – 9 to 11 a.m.

Funding: FSP and the city will split the cost of up to \$500 for bare root and/or potted native trees and plants. FSP will pay for drinks and snacks.

Anticipated City Support (staff, materials, etc.): The city will:

- acquire \$500 worth of bare root or potted native trees and plants;
- deliver the plants to an agreed upon site before the project date;
- provide shovels and other tools as needed; and

Funding: FSP will pay for class materials as needed.
