GOOD NEWS

Uplands was awarded a Community Enhancement Grant to design and landscape the entrance into our neighborhood at Twin Fir and Boones Ferry Roads. The land south on Twin Fir from Hope Church is City property. It is being made available for the landscaping. The Reverend Keith Dickerson of Hope Church and his members have agreed to install a waterline extension. The City will install a water meter and cover the cost of the water. Members of the church have volunteered to maintain the landscaping. Thank you! Our resident landscape architect, Nancy Gronowski, created the design for the grant application. Audrey Mattison and Ron Hanson wrote the grant application. A special thanks for their successful efforts.

Part of the grant covers an entrance sign. Check out the sign at Uplands and Country Club Road at the planting strip. Do you like that one, or different words or no sign? We need your input at our April 26th meeting.

SURFACE WATER SURVEY

Your assistance will make it possible for our neighborhood association to properly address and evaluate ongoing development applications and storm water issues. Please use the following guidelines to document adverse surface water conditions:

- **Location** – address, catch basin or street location [nearest intersection]
- **Type** – standing water, plugged culvert, slow drainage
- **Source** – new, change in existing or obstruction
- **Photo** – preferably with date and time noted
- **Incidence** – half-hour downpour, two-day rainy period, snow/ice melt
- **Volume/Velocity** – estimated new event or change in existing
- **Property Impact** – erosion, leaks, soggy ground
- **Standing Water** – approximate length, width and depth
- **Duration** – hours and days

Also, if a specific incident has previously impacted your home and/or yard:

Did you contact the City of Lake Oswego Engineering Dept about the problem?

Did the City confirm and/or repair any damage attributed to the surface water system?
